



## Member Spotlight Timothy Lederach

An interview with Lynne Kaiser

For our second instalment of Member Spotlight, we are featuring Timothy Lederach, a longtime, multiple award-winning CAL member. Mr. Lederach has won prizes nearly every year since joining CAL in 2013. In 2014, he pulled off the "CAL Trifecta", taking home ribbons from the Pruyn House Show, the Town Show, and the Holiday Show. Most recently, Lederach's exquisite watercolor "Zulu Potter" earned a 1<sup>st</sup> Place award in the virtual Pruyn House Show.

Without further ado, we introduce Timothy Lederach:

LK: Let's start at the beginning. Where are you from?

TL: I grew up in the Pennsylvania Dutch region of Montgomery County, PA approximately 30 miles NW of Philadelphia. The Lederach family has lived there since 1713. My maternal side goes back to the 1686 in Philadelphia, so there is a lot of family history in Southeastern Pennsylvania.

LK: Fascinating. So, what brought you to the Capital District?

TL: I moved here in 1976 after graduation from Penn State to work for GE in Finance. I worked in Schenectady at GE Power for 37 years, the last 27 years as the International Tax Director for GE Power. I retired at the end of 2012.

LK: And your family?

TL: My wife Kathi and I have been married for 37 years. We have lived in Niskayuna in the same house since we were married.

LK: What is your educational background?

TL: I have a BS in Accounting from Penn State and am a graduate of GE's Financial Management Program. My only formal art education is studying architecture at Penn State for 1 1/2 years. However, I come from a family of artists. Four architects (maternal grandfather and aunt, father, and brother), two wedding dress designers/makers (maternal grandmother and paternal aunt), a landscape architect brother and another paternal aunt who was a professional watercolor artist. My father also painted in acrylics, pastels and watercolor and my maternal grandmother

painted in oils and pastels. So, I received a lot of informal art education throughout my youth. I learned a lot about design working in the family's architecture office every summer as a teenager as well as during my time in architecture at Penn State. My grandmother and father gave me a lot of instruction on drawing and painting when I was younger. I have not attended any watercolor workshops, but I have read a lot of books and watched a lot of online videos, so I am essentially self-developed in watercolor.

LK: It appears from your subject matter that you are a well-traveled person. Tell me about that.

TL: My wife and I love to travel. Between personal and business travel with GE I have visited 62 countries and 40 US states. We have been to sub-Saharan Africa seven times. That travel is the main source of most of the subjects for my paintings. I love photography and have taken thousands of photos on these trips. I spend a lot of time browsing through these photos for likely painting subjects.

LK: Are there any favorite subjects that to you like to paint?

TL: I don't really have a favorite subject. I don't paint a lot of landscapes, but otherwise still-life, florals, wildlife, people, and architecture are all fair game. I try to mix it up.

LK: Is art your primary occupation?

TL: I am retired, but I enjoy any creative activity. I love travel, photography, and gardening in addition to painting. I do try to spend about 2-4 hours every day working on some aspect of the painting process.

LK: How did you first become involved in art?

TL: I have been involved in art my whole life. Between the family architectural business, my grandmother's dress design business and my grandmother's and father's painting, I was surrounded by it. When I was younger, I mostly worked in colored pencil, charcoal, pen and ink, and pastel. I intermittently did things as time permitted during my working career. I enjoy cartooning. I drew a cartoon strip for my school paper as a kid and have done a lot of cartoon greeting cards for family and friends through the years.

LK: Are you influenced by any artists in particular?

TL: I look to the watercolorists like Homer, Sargent, Turner, Wyeth, and Hopper for inspiration. Current well-known watercolorists I really like are Dean Mitchell, Morton Solberg, Karen Laurence Rowe, Guan Weixing and Catherine O'Neill. I also have gotten inspiration from some of our fellow CAL members. For example, I love the way Lori Sylvester creates an abstract painting with a realistic rendering of a crumbled-up shirt. That taught me that you can combine abstraction and realism together and find it in ordinary objects.

LK: And what prompted you to choose the medium you work in?

TL: My father took up watercolor in his later years, forsaking his acrylics and pastels. He encouraged me to take up the medium. Also, my father's sister was a professional watercolor artist in Southeastern Pennsylvania, and I loved her work. Because of its fluidity and non-permanence, it can be a temperamental medium. When done properly it has a luminescent quality to it, but any misstep can very easily turn it to mud. I like the challenge the medium presents and the resultant luminescent completed piece.

LK: I agree. So, can you share your creative process with us?

TL: I work in my home studio solely from photos that I have taken. I spend a lot of time combing through photos from our trips looking for things to paint. I look for interesting subjects with a good composition & dramatic light. Sometimes I find a painting in a portion of a photo that I crop out. Sometimes I take things from multiple photos and combine them. I spend a lot of time on the drawing & composition. I am not a fast artist. I usually spend at least 1 and most times two months on a painting. A lot of that time is drawing. I am a Virgo, so I cannot help but meticulously draw every little value shape that I see in the photo that I want in the final painting. That is a slow process for me, involving a lot of erasing and redoing. But the upside of this meticulous process is that I identify all the value shapes and as I am drawing them, I am thinking about how I will paint each value shape. When I paint, I apply layers of pigment washes to slowly build up from light to dark. It is not unusual to apply five or more washes on the darkest values. This is what gives watercolor its luminescent quality. In the final stages I will take the painting around the house to view it in different light. This helps me fine tune the values.

LK: Do you prefer any brands or types of paints, paper, and brushes?

TL: I mostly use Daniel Smith paints. I try to limit my palette on a painting to a couple of general hues. I use Arches paper. Mostly 140 lb. cold press but I have used hot press on a few paintings -- whatever works best to achieve the effect that I want. I just started using Blick Kolinsky brushes. In the past I used Windsor Newton Sceptre Gold II brushes which I liked a lot, but they needed to be replaced.

LK: Tim, do you sell your work?

TL: When I joined CAL, I intended to sell at some point. But our own walls and those of our family and friends keep providing homes for everything I paint. Someday, maybe, when family and friends have reached the saturation point.

Right now, I basically just submit to competitions - CAL and some national juried water-based media shows. Since 2015 I have had five paintings accepted into the Adirondack National Exhibition of American Watercolors held in Old Forge, NY.

LK: Awesome! That is a prestigious juried show so just getting in is a reward. By the way, when did you join the Colonie Art League? I know you have won numerous awards -- how many and for which paintings?

TL: I joined CAL in January 2013 after I retired. Jim and Lucy Comly are CAL members and my next-door neighbors. They got me involved. I have been very fortunate to win seventeen awards in CAL shows since 2013:
