#### Entry dates: June 4 - June 25

#### Rules for entry:

- Each CAL member may enter one (1) original two-dimensional piece completed within the last three years.
- Only original artwork is accepted.
- Work must not have been shown in any prior CAL-sponsored exhibit
- Any two-dimensional medium including photography may be entered.
- Pictures of the artwork must be submitted via an entry form which will be available on the CAL website from Friday, June 4 Friday, June 25. The picture must not exceed 5MB in size and, if possible, should not include a mat or frame. (Please see the article, *Tips for Taking Good Photos of Artwork for Virtual Show Submissions*, in the Nov/Dec 2020 newsletter.)
- Artwork submitted may be priced for sale. Interested buyers will be directed to contact the artist directly.

He plans on studying architecture at the University level. From South Colonie High School, **Enzo Lontoc** was selected. He plans on studying digital art and animation at the University level.

## Member Spotlight Thomas O'Toole

An interview with Lynne Kaiser

Member Spotlight is a new feature of our CAL Newsletter. In each issue, I will interview a different member. Eventually, we will get to know all our members.

For our first feature, we chose Tom O'Toole. Tom joined CAL in 2020 and volunteered to work on publicity by editing and publishing news releases and articles. As

you read on and become acquainted with Tom's art, you will see why we chose Tom O'Toole to be our first Member Spotlight feature - talented and humble, Tom works quietly behind the scenes, to promote CAL to the public.

LK: When did you first become interested in drawing? And, by the way, why drawing?

TO: I first became interested in drawing as a young child. I would copy art in pencil and crayon from comic books.

LK: What is your process? Could you share that with us?

TO: I take my own photographs, put a grid on the 5" x 7", for example, and increase it to a grid on an 11" x 14" area, then begin by enlarging the image for my drawing using the grids.

LK: What kind of pencils do you use?

TO: I use Toison D'or pencils of different hardness but have done a complete work using just a No. 2 pencil and affecting varying values. I did my portrait, "Nathan" that way. I also work with acrylics, colored pencils, and pastels. I recently purchased some watercolor tubes, brushes, paper, etc. and hope to venture into that too.

LK: How do you choose your subjects?

TO: I choose subjects that have beauty for me.

LK: Lovely thought. Have you had any formal instruction in art?

TO: I have taken art courses at Hudson Valley Community College, the Albany Institute of History and Art, the Art Center for the Capital Region, and I have received a certificate for completing a 28-lesson correspondence course with Art Instruction Schools of Minneapolis, MN.

LK: How long have you lived in the Capital Region?

TO: I have lived in Albany my entire life except when I worked for a couple of years in Buffalo, NY as a staff writer for United Press International, right out of college.

LK: On that topic, where did you attend college?

TO: I graduated from Siena, where I got my BA in English. Also received an MS in Communication from RPI.

LK: Other than your art, what was your occupation?

TO: I spent 34 years as a senior editor with the State Education Department, where I worked on Commissioner speeches, Regents position papers, newsletters and the State Regents Examinations.

LK: What can you tell us about your family?

TO: I have a son, Sean, who is 49, and is a professor at Bernard Baruch College in New York City and a daughter, Erin, who is 46, and a CFO for Los Angeles County for the Red Cross.

LK: Do you have any interest in selling your art?

TO: I have sold works at a gallery in Saratoga Springs and to private individuals, but my best reward is when I gift my art to family and friends.

LK: What a beautiful sentiment to end on. Thank you, Tom, for being in the spotlight!
