

American painter Eden Compton was born in Texas and raised in Connecticut. She currently resides in Saratoga Springs, NY where she has a teaching studio and fine art gallery. She works in multiple mediums including pastel, oil, acrylic and gouache.

Prior to settling in upstate New York, Eden and her NZ born husband, Richard, spent many years sailing and managing private charter boats in the Caribbean and throughout the US East Coast. "My extensive travel has sparked an interest in

different types of subject matter ranging from rural landscapes to rainy cityscapes to colorful market scenes as well as figurative subjects and interior paintings. I am

particularly enamored of the colorful grays and variety of shapes found in the urban landscape."

Eden's formal training began with a B.A. in Art History at Colgate University and independent courses at the International Center for Photography in NYC. She also has studied independently and in workshops with nationally known artists over many years. Her award winning work has been included in national juried shows including the Catherine Lorillard Society, Salmagundi Open Non Member Juried Exhibit, the International Pastel Society, American Impressionist Society online members show as well as numerous regional and local shows.
